Transportation Planning Update

Since 2007, Coordinated Public Transit-Human Services Transportation Plans (Coordinated Plans) have been a crucial tool for regional multimodal transit planning. These plans aim to improve transportation services for persons with disabilities, older adults, and individuals with lower incomes by ensuring that communities coordinate resources available for public transportation. The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) of 2021 continued the requirement from previous federal transportation reauthorization bills that all projects selected for Federal Transit Administration (FTA) program funding be included on a locally-developed coordinated plan. FTA established that a coordinated plan must include:

- An assessment of current available transportation services (public, private, and non-profit);
- An assessment of transportation needs for seniors, persons with disabilities, and low-income individuals;
- Strategies and/or projects to address the identified gaps between current services and needs; and
- Priorities for implementation based on resources, time, and feasibility.

The requirements for coordinated plans place emphasis on stakeholder engagement and public involvement to ensure that the plan is designed by, and benefits, those who need and use public transportation. FTA provides guidance on public participation in Circular C 9070.1G Chapter V, Part 3 to assist agencies in reaching stakeholders.
