When Marilyn enrolled in the LAUNCH! Out-of-School Youth Program, she was navigating life as a new parent without a clear plan for her future. Like many young adults, she knew she wanted something more, but wasn't sure where to start.

Through LAUNCH!, Marilyn connected with a Career Advisor who took the time to understand her goals, strengths, and barriers. Together, they explored career options and mapped out a path forward. One of the most impactful steps in Marilyn's journey was being connected to additional resources that could help support her long-term success.

Through a co-enrollment with the EARN program, Marilyn was able to pursue training as a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN). With support for childcare, transportation, and school supplies, she was able to stay focused and committed to her education.

Throughout the process, her LAUNCH! Career Advisor remained a consistent source of encouragement—checking in, celebrating milestones, and helping her stay on track.

Today, Marilyn has successfully completed her LPN training and is employed with Laurel Health as a clinic nurse. She is now building a stable future for herself and her family in a meaningful, in-demand career.

# Financial Literacy through 'Reality Fairs'



Northern Tier Regional Planning and Development Commission's (NTRPDC's) Business Education Partnership (NTBEP) partnered with Ingersoll-Rand Federal Credit Union (IRFCU) to present "Financial Reality Fairs" to students in multiple school districts.

Designed as a hands-on, immersive experience for 10th-graders, the fair provides students with a realistic glimpse into adult financial life. Students are paired up and assigned a financial profile that lists a salary, credit score, number of children, assets, credit card debt, and student loan obligations.

IRFCU contacts local businesses and organizations to participate and present at simulation stations such as housing, childcare, health care, transportation, etc. Students must navigate these expenses and work on their budgeting techniques. All the participants from local businesses and organizations

are enthusiastic and outgoing, and eager to talk the students through what they need to do to accomplish their budget plans.

The Financial Reality Fairs reflect a growing commitment to equipping young people with practical life skills and a strong foundation in financial literacy, ensuring they are better prepared to manage their futures with confidence.

The fairs were held at Towanda, Troy, Athens, Wyalusing and Northeast Bradford high schools. Incorporating this event also assists school districts in meeting the PA Career Education standards 13.1.11 and 13.3.11.

# Susquehanna County LAUNCH! Success Story: Joshua

When Joshua first enrolled in the LAUNCH! program in Susquehanna County (operated by Trehab), he had no prior work experience and knew that would be a major barrier to finding employment on his own. He also shared that he felt unsure of his ability to “do a good job” and was nervous about interacting with new people.

After connecting with his Career Advising team, Joshua agreed to start small by stocking shelves at a local food bank for a few hours each week.

After just one week, his site supervisor shared glowing feedback. She mentioned it was hard to believe this was Joshua’s first job. He showed up on time, asked questions when needed, and quickly picked up his responsibilities.

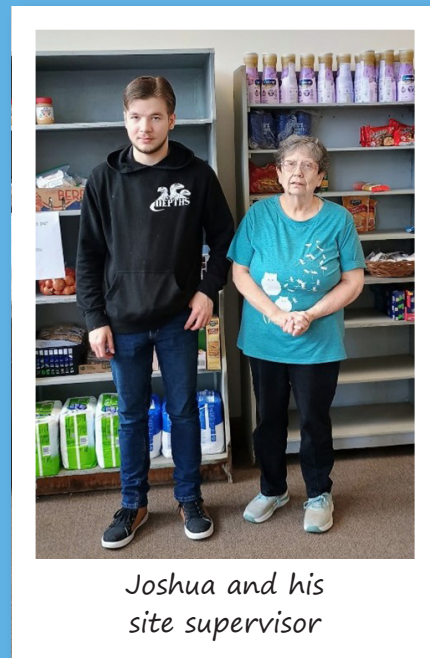
As his initial contract neared completion, it became clear that neither Joshua nor his supervisor was ready for the experience to end. Joshua chose to extend his work experience and even increased his weekly hours.

Joshua’s short-term goals now include using this new work

experience to secure a position stocking shelves in a larger setting, with the long-term goal of transitioning into full-time employment.

Those who work with Joshua in other areas have also noticed a big change. His confidence has grown, evidenced by the way he carries himself, communicates, and engages with others.

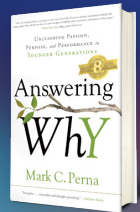

# Bradford-Sullivan Career Day 2026

Northern Tier Regional Planning and Development Commission (NTRPDC) and the Northern Tier Business Education Partnership (NTBEP) held the annual Bradford-Sullivan Career Day at Towanda High School on March 19, 2026. More than 700 students in grades 6-12 from nine schools in Bradford and Sullivan counties (Athens, Canton, Grace Christian Academy, Northeast Bradford, Sullivan County, Towanda Elementary, Towanda High School, Troy, and Wyalusing) had the opportunity to meet with employers to learn about local careers and career pathways.

The goal of Career Day is to increase career awareness and provide a glimpse into the various career pathways that are available in the Northern Tier Region in hopes of retaining the region's workforce for tomorrow. Thirty-eight businesses and organizations—the most ever at the event—had representatives available to share educational and training requirements for specific careers as well as job responsibilities and work environments related to those careers. A variety of industries were represented at the event, including

but not limited to healthcare, finance, manufacturing, agriculture, oil and gas, and human services.

Virtual reality (VR) headsets were provided again this year by NTRPDC to offer students another avenue to learn about different occupations. More than 70 students utilized the VR headsets to explore more than 55 careers offered through the career education software. Knee surgery as a surgical tech and fixing farm equipment as a diesel technician were two of the most popular career simulations viewed during Career Day.

NTRPDC thanks all of the presenting businesses and organizations for participating, Towanda School District for hosting, all of the districts who sent students, and the students who attended. Career Day is important for the future of our region and would not be possible without such wonderful partnerships. Thanks also to Spalding Memorial Library, which donated three iPads that were raffled to participating students.

## Innovative Remote Internship Connects Rural Youth and Employers

A remote internship is currently underway with Woodland Biomass Innovations, marking the LAUNCH! program's first fully remote internship opportunity. Woodland Biomass Innovations is a forward-thinking company focused on sustainable energy solutions and biomass innovation, making them a strong partner for hands-on, real-world learning. Their willingness to expand into a remote internship model further reflects their innovative approach to both industry and workforce development.

The position has allowed a Sullivan County participant to gain valuable work experience despite geographic distance, showcasing an effective and creative way to connect youth in rural Northern Tier communities with meaningful career opportunities.

Maria, who was unable to attend college as originally planned in the fall, was selected for the opportunity after it was shared regionally. Since beginning the internship in early October 2025, she has been actively completing marketing-related assignments in a fully remote work environment while building important workplace skills.

Beyond skill development, this experience has been highly valuable in helping Maria identify her long-term career path. While she initially planned to pursue post-secondary education in business or marketing, hands-on experience through the internship helped her realize that marketing is not the right fit for her. With strong support and guidance from her employer, she has since identified an interest in engineering and has begun taking college courses in that field.

# Government in the Classroom

The sophomore class at Towanda High School had the opportunity to interact with State Representative Tina Pickett, Bradford County Commissioner Zachary Gates, and Towanda Mayor Garrett Miller at a January 2026 "Government in the Classroom" assembly. Civics teacher Jed Lezak worked with the 10th-graders in advance to compile thoughtful questions for these government officials, while NTRPDC Career Coaches Donna Yale and Jessica Pepper coordinated with the speakers and the school to organize the event. Approximately 115 students participated.

The assembly began with each elected official sharing a little about themselves and how they got to where they are today. Next, the students asked questions directed toward one or all of the speakers. Pickett, Gates, and Miller provided in-depth responses to the questions and shared wisdom with the students.

For example, Commissioner Gates noted that "what you study may not be what you do." He majored in chemistry at Pennsylvania State University and graduated from Penn State Dickinson Law. He explained that he originally thought he wanted to be a research chemist but decided against that after interning as a lab assistant.

Representative Pickett said that as a small business owner she was often on boards of directors working to understand what was going on in the region, which led to her interest in government. All three officials believe that what keeps

them doing what they do is their "heart for service," noting that if you do not have that, then being an elected official is not for you.

The officials urged students to "grab everything you can from school, and read, read, read to stay current." Most importantly, when you turn 18, register to vote. As Mayor Miller stated, "Voting is the way to have your voice heard." All three speakers encouraged the students to learn as much as possible about current events and issues so that they understand what they are voting for.

The students were captivated by the discussion. They enjoyed having guest speakers and connecting with a state representative, county commissioner, and mayor in their high school. Providing the Government in the Classroom assembly also helped the school meet the PA Career Education Standard 13.3.11. Thank you to Representative Pickett, Commissioner Gates, and Mayor Miller for participating in this meaningful event and investing in the next generation.

Develop Tioga extends a special thank you to all of the school districts, students, businesses, and partners that helped make the event possible.

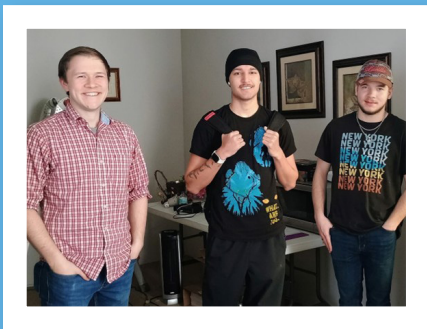

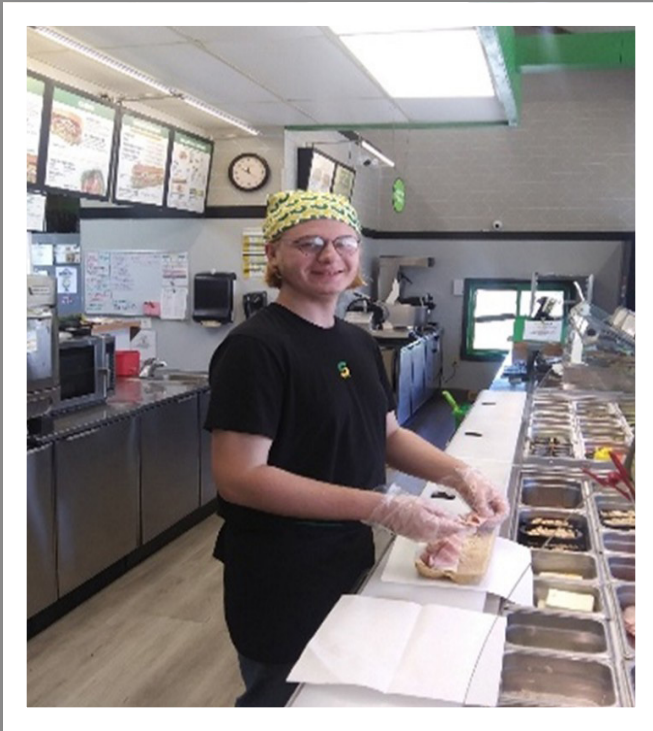

# Bradford County LAUNCH! Success Story: Cody



Cody enrolled in the LAUNCH! program in Bradford County (operated by Bradford County Action) in September 2025. He did not have a high school diploma and had some barriers to overcome. He wanted to complete the General Educational Development Test (GED®) so that he could pursue a Culinary Arts/

Business Management career, with his ultimate goal being to someday own his own restaurant.

Cody worked hard and passed his math and science GED® test sections in November. He scored college-level results on both tests! Cody passed the social studies part of the GED® in February 2026 and successfully completed the reading section in March. Cody was very proud to earn his GED® diploma!

He also completed the O\*Net interest inventory, which showed his top interests were in Enterprising, Conventional, and Artistic careers—a perfect fit for his goals. Cody explored employment options and decided to pursue a job in the food service industry. Cody was also given information on the SERVSAFE Certificate Program that Northern Tier Career Center offers.

Cody interviewed and was hired at Subway as a Sandwich Artist in February. After working for a few weeks, Cody was promoted to a Shift Lead in Training position.

He is happy with his job at Subway, and having earned a GED®, is qualified to be promoted to manager. He plans to continue to work and is happy to be doing something he enjoys. Congratulations, Cody!

## Openings at Red Rock Job Corps

Red Rock Job Corps Center is actively enrolling new students seeking skilled trades training in the nation's leading industries.

Red Rock Job Corps Center offers openings and free career training in the nation's leading industries for 16-through 24-year-olds from low-income households. Job Corps provides hands-on career skills training, on-campus housing, meals, health care and job search assistance. Red Rock Job Corps Center offers skilled trades training in Maintenance & Light

Repair, Collision Repair, Carpentry, Electrical, Office Administration, and Plumbing.

Applicants may qualify if they receive benefits such as SNAP, TANF, or free or reduced school lunch, or if they are experiencing homelessness or are a foster youth. Job Corps offers expedited enrollment for age-eligible young adults experiencing homelessness.

# Students Participate in Mock Interviews

In November 2025, more than 150 students from the Northern Tier Region participated in mock interviews with more than 20 local employers. Career coaches Donna Yale and Jessica Pepper worked with the guidance departments at Northeast Bradford and Towanda Area high schools to arrange for 10th- and 11th-grade students to meet one-on-one with employer volunteers for structured practice

interviews that simulate real-world hiring conversations.

During the mock interviews, employers asked common interview questions, offered feedback on communication and professionalism, and helped students understand what businesses look for when hiring. The experience enabled students to build confidence, strengthen their soft skills, and prepare for future job or

internship opportunities in a supportive, low-pressure environment. It also allowed local businesses to connect with their future workforce. One participating employer remarked, "I wish this type of experience had been available at my high school!" Another praised the event and suggested more school districts throughout the region offer students a similar experience to prepare them for job-hunting.

## SCCTC Awards CDL Scholarships to 18 Northern Tier High School Seniors

Drivers with a commercial driver's license (CDL) continue to be in high demand across our Northern Tier Region and nationwide. Most freight within the U.S. is transported by tractor-trailer via our highway system. The increase in goods being delivered by major corporations such as Amazon and Walmart has further increased the need for CDL truck operators.

Through a generous donation from Coterra Energy, SCCTC had the pleasure of awarding full tuition scholarships (\$6,000 each) for CDL training to 18 high school seniors. After graduating from high school, the scholarship winners will take SCCTC's CDL training course during Summer 2026. Students from the five-county Northern Tier Region were eligible to apply for

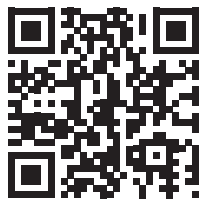
the CDL program and then apply for the scholarship.
